You'll find truer words were never spoken as you experience the thrill of riding on the historic Durango to Silverton railway, coupled with the magnificent scenery of the Rocky Mountains! There's something undeniably intriguing about trains — the familiar old whistle with its promise of high adventure, and the gentle rocking on the rails as you travel through colorful canyons and alongside tumbling rivers!

Your tour showcases magical northern New Mexico as well as the most scenic Rocky Mountain roads in southwestern Colorado. Explore the historic mining towns of Durango and Silverton. Gaze in awe at the primitive majesty of the Taos Pueblo and the shifting sands of Sand Dunes National Park. Walk in the footsteps of "The Ancient Ones" at Mesa Verde, descending below the cliffs to dwellings inhabited 1000 years ago. Join TRIPS as we share with you the land that inspired these famous words ...

O beautiful for spacious skies, for amber waves of grain! For purple mountain majesties, above the fruited plain!

Itinerary

August 14, 2023 - Welcome to New Mexico - Santa Fe!

Your journey to the "Land of Enchantment" begins today as you arrive in beautiful Albuquerque - then you're off and away to experience the marvels of Santa Fe! Named by Travel and Leisure as the #1 U.S. Cultural Getaway, Santa Fe is the oldest capital city in North America and today it's a magical, exuberant place that celebrates its long, unique past. Of course, Santa Fe is world-famous for its thriving art scene, so you'll see galleries galore with art spilling out into yards and moving sculptures fueled by the wind. You'll also find there are five museums, walking tours, and relaxing spas. And with plenty of shopping all around, whether you're searching for cowboy boots or concho belts, salsa or turquoise jewelry, you'll find it and so much more! After checking in to the renowned Inn of the Governors, prepare to enjoy your welcome dinner nearby in the historic Santa Fe Plaza!

Overnight: Santa Fe - Inn of the Governors (D)

August 15, 2023 - Santa Fe, Taos Pueblo + Great Sand Dunes!

Enjoy breakfast at the Inn before check-out, then your guided tour of **Santa Fe** that includes the famed 1878 **Loretto Chapel** and its "miraculous" spiral staircase! Afterward you're off to visit spellbinding **Taos Pueblo**, the only living Native American community designated both a **World Heritage Site by UNESCO** and a National Historic Landmark, and whose multi-story adobe buildings have been **continuously inhabited for over 1,000 years!** The main part of the present buildings were most likely built between 1000 and 1450 A.D., and appeared much as they do today when the first Spanish explorers arrived in 1540. The Pueblo is made entirely of adobe - earth mixed with water and

straw, then either poured into forms or made into sun-dried bricks. The walls are frequently several feet thick, and continuously maintained by replastering with thin layers of mud. The Pueblo is actually many individual homes, built side-by-side and in layers, with common walls but no connecting doorways. In earlier days there were no doors or windows, so entry was gained only from the top. After this, you'll head up to Colorado with lunch provided along the way. Here you'll visit **Great Sand Dunes National Park**, Colorado's very own sandbox - of epic proportions! Covering more than 30 square miles, these are the highest mountains of sand in North America, with the **tallest dunes towering at 750 feet!** These continuously shifting golden sands sit at the foot of the **Sangre de Cristo Mountains**, and are truly an unexpected delight! Later today you'll travel to picturesque **Salida**, known as the "**Heart of the Rockies**," to check in for the night with your dinner included.

Overnight: Salida - Gateway Inn (B/L/D)

August 16, 2023 - Crested Butte, Rocky Mtn. Vistas & Durango! This morning after your breakfast and checkout, you'll leave Salida with views of 14,000-foot peaks to climb over Monarch Pass, at an elevation of 11,312 on the Continental Divide, to reach Crested Butte. Once bustling with coal and silver miners, Crested Butte sits in an alpine meadow surrounded by majestic peaks and is host to festivals showcasing art, music, mountain biking, film and wildflowers. Here at the "Last Great Colorado Ski Town," you can explore historic Elk Avenue with many fun choices for shopping and lunch in this magical Old West setting. You'll also travel through the highly scenic Rocky Mountain towns of Gunnison, Montrose and Ouray. Afterward, you'll set off for the historic old west railroad town of Durango.

Downtown Durango is a Nationally Registered Historic District and home to colorful brewpubs, art galleries, museums and shops. This afternoon you'll check in to your hotel where you may dine nearby, or perhaps stroll down Main Street to enjoy dinner on your own tonight.

Overnight: Downtown Durango Hotel (B)

August 17, 2023 - Spectacular Mesa Verde and more Durango!

Following your hotel breakfast and check-out, you'll travel to amazing Mesa Verde, the ancestral home to Pueblo people for over 700 years and one of America's greatest wonders. It's the nation's largest archeological preserve with an astounding 600 cliff dwellings, ranging from a single room to villages that housed more than 150! At the Visitors Center you'll get an introduction to the culture of the "Ancient Ones" before taking a guided tour through some of the most famous ruins. In the late 1190s, after living on the mesa top for six centuries, many Puebloans began moving down into pueblos they built right beneath Mesa Verde's overhanging cliffs! Still farming up on the mesa tops, they resided in these amazing cliff dwellings for nearly a century before migrating south to New Mexico and Arizona. After your full day exploring incredible Mesa Verde, you'll return to your hotel in colorful Durango, and then enjoy tonight's included dinner.

Overnight: Downtown Durango Hotel (B/D)

August 18, 2023 - All Aboard to Silverton!

After your breakfast at the hotel, it's time to ride the historic **Durango** and **Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad**, in continuous operation since 1882! Built to haul silver and gold ore from the **San Juan Mountains**, passengers soon realized what was truly precious were the views. Your 45 mile journey along the **Animas River** boasts some of **Colorado's most striking canyon scenery**, as your steam engine train crosses the river

five times with spectacular vistas on both sides. You'll pass through fertile farm lands, old stagecoach roads and mining camps along the way. On arrival in **Silverton**, you'll have time for lunch on your own as well as a bit of shopping and roaming around its quaint downtown boutiques and vintage buildings. Built in the late 1800's, Silverton luckily never experienced a major fire so most of the structures from that era are still standing! Later on you'll travel back to **Durango** along the spectacular "million dollar highway," with great views of **crystal lakes** and **rugged peaks rising over 14,000 feet**, then return to your hotel with tonight's dinner on your own.

Overnight: Downtown Durango Hotel

August 19, 2023 - Native Lands, Museums and Albuquerque!

This morning after your hotel breakfast and check-out, you'll bid farewell to Colorado, then learn about the three main **Native groups of New Mexico** as you travel through **Navajo**, **Apache and Pueblo** lands on the way to **Albuquerque** in time for lunch. This afternoon, you'll visit the **Indian Pueblo Cultural Center**, the gateway to the 19 Pueblos of New Mexico, to visit their museum and enjoy a dance performance. In **Old Town Albuquerque**, you'll see the historic Plaza and visit the **Albuquerque Museum of Art and History**, before checking in to your hotel. Your **New Mexico farewell dinner** tonight will be at a sprawling hacienda with enormous cottonwoods!

Overnight: Albuquerque - Drury Inn

Following your hotel breakfast, you'll transfer to the Albuquerque airport for your flight home. **Memories of your enchanted days in Colorado and New Mexico will be with you for years to come!** (B)
